Day pack (if you plan to hike)
Sleeping bag (in waterproof container)
Small pillow
Sleeping pad
Tent
Ground cloth
Plastic garbage bags
Plate/cup/utensils
Duct tape
Rope/parachute cord
Extra tent stakes

Clothing

Hiking Boots/sneakers
(Depending on the event)
Hiking Socks (if planning to hike)
Wicking Sock liners (if planning to hike)
Socks for sneakers
Long pants (fleece or wool)
Quick drying shorts
Short sleeved shirt
Belt
Regular underwear
Synthetic Underwear top and bottom
Fleece Jacket/parka
Sun hat
